

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About Hagerstown Community College

Hagerstown Community College (HCC), originally Hagerstown Junior College, was founded in 1946 as Maryland's first community college. HCC is accredited by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education and is a member of the American Association of Community Colleges. The College is comprised of 18 buildings across 319 acres in Washington County in Western Maryland. Over 100 credit programs leading to associate degrees, lower division certificates, or letters of recognition are offered oncampus and online. A wide variety of non-credit classes and programs for certification, licensure, workforce training, or personal enrichment are also offered.

HCC's athletic teams are known as the Hawks, and the primary color is green. The College slogan is *Stay close. Go far.*



Credit Programs

Students at HCC may enroll in an accredited course of study leading to an associate degree, lower division certificate, or letter of recommendation. The credit programs are overseen by the Vice President of Academic Affairs & Student Services, Dean of Instruction, and Dean of Distance Learning. HCC offers over 100 programs of study across eight divisions. Three dual enrollment programs enable high school students to take courses for college credit. These programs are the Career and Technical Education (CATE) Early College Program, the Early College Access Program (ECAP), and Early College Degree Program (ECDP).



Figure 3.1 Twelve-Month Unduplicated Headcount and Percent Change- Credit Students



Figure 3.4 Fall 2023 Credit Enrollment: Age and Geographic Origin



Figure 3.5 Fall 2023 Credit Enrollment: Military Status



Figure 3.6 Fall 2023 Credit Enrollment: Distance Education





Figure 3.8 Fall Credit Programs Assigned by Type








Figure 4.1 Credit Program Award Recipients and Awards Conferred



Figure 4.2 Credit Program Awards Conferred by Type





Figure 5.1 Tuition & Fees: Hagerstown Community College vs. Systemwide Average, Fall 2023



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

Figure 6.2 Expenses by Functional Area: FY 2023








Figure 7.1 Employees by Contract Type



Figure 7.2 Faculty Headcount by Instruction Type



Figure 7.3 Employee Race and Ethnicity


